
Welcome Back



Kindergarten Meet The Teacher

Parents of Kindergarten students are invited to attend a Meet The Teacher session on Wednesday 13th February at 3.10pm – 3.30pm in the Kindergarten classrooms. You will have an opportunity at a later date to have an interview where you can discuss with your child's teachers their Best Start Assessment.

Class Dojo

At Athelstane, class teachers use a program called Class Dojo. We believe the partnership between school and home is vital and Class Dojo allows us to share information on the work habits, learning and behaviour of your children.

It is an app that you can download on your phone or access via a computer.

If class teachers have not as yet sent you an invitation to join, they will do so soon.



School Starting times

School starts at 9.00am sharp. A teacher is on duty from 8.40 am and students must not come to school before the time that they will be supervised.

If students do arrive to school before 8.40am there is no playing as there is no teacher supervision.

Students are to sit in Area 3 until a teacher commences playground duty at 8.40am.

Students who are late must collect a 'late note' from the school office.

No child will be allowed to leave the school without a 'leave early' note from the school office. This procedure is to safe-guard and protect both parents and staff. Please do not put staff in a difficult position by asking them if they can take their children straight from the classroom, as all are under instruction to say no.

Accessing the School During School Hours

Following the commencement of the school day, all gates to the school except for the Horsell Ave (school office side) will be locked.

If you need to access the school during school hours, please enter from Horsell Ave gates and make your way to the school office.

Notes - Important

Please check your child's bag each day or teach them to hand to you the notes that are sent home.

Library / Excursion Bags

Purchase your bag from the school office. It is suitable as a library and excursion bag. All students require a library bag in order to borrow from the school library.

Sending Money To School

This year we will continue to use the system whereby we ask parents to return notes and money in an envelope. Please remember to clearly mark your child's name and class on the envelope and send the note with the money.

Students should give money to their classroom teacher as soon as they enter the classroom in the morning.

Once your money is receipted, your child will be given a receipt to take home.

Mobile Phones

Students are encouraged not to bring mobile phones to school. If it is an absolute necessity, students are to sign



their phone in to the office first thing in the morning and pick up their phone at the end of the school day.

Lunch Orders

All students should either bring their lunch from home or order from the canteen. Students should not have money to buy their lunch. They may be disappointed if they miss out. Money should be for snacks.

Tip: Buy some paper bags to keep at home. Fill them out and drop them in to the canteen before 9am or in the class lunch basket.



Internet and Email for students

As part of the NSW Department of Education's commitment to providing an e-Learning environment to enrich learning opportunities for all students in NSW public schools, all students have access to Internet browsing and email.

Your child has an individual username and password to access filtered Internet browsing and email at school. Their user name and password will ensure that they receive Internet filtering and that no one else can access their email.

Students are able to access their personal email from computers at home and other locations through private Internet service providers. All Internet browsing at home will be directed through your own Internet service provider. We recommend that you install filtering software at home.

Also, in publishing our school website we may include your child in photographs and will only ever use your child's first name.

If you do not agree to your child accessing the internet or using their photograph on our school website, you will need to provide notification in writing to the school.

Occupational Therapy

Our school is continuing to employ an Occupational Therapist throughout 2019.

Stephanie is a qualified Occupational Therapist who works for Educational Speech Pathology & Therapy Services.

Stephanie's main role will be to **work with our teachers** in the whole classroom to support the gross motor and fine motor skills of the children.

The Occupational Therapy program will operate in the classrooms of Kindergarten to Year 2. Parents of these classes will be invited to attend an introductory meeting in Term 1.

Unfortunately, individual students cannot be directly referred to the Occupational Therapist.

If your child already attends occupational therapy outside of school please **do not stop attending**. The Educational Speech Pathology program cannot offer the same individualised therapy your child will receive through either Community Health or Private occupational therapy.

Stephanie will be posting occupational therapy tips in each newsletter so please keep your eye on this space!

Mathletics and Reading Eggs

To support student learning in Reading and Mathematics, our school will continue to use these programs to reinforce the learning that is taking place at school.

Your child's log in details will be sent home soon. Keep them in a safe place.

Picking Up Your Children At the End Of The School Day



If you are picking up your children after school, it would be helpful to have a meeting point within the school grounds.


Please note that on Athelstane Ave there is a pick-up zone directly outside the school gates. It is ILLEGAL to park your car there. That pick up zone is to drive up, wait in your car, pick up and leave.

On Horsell Ave (office side) there is no pick-up zone. You cannot park your car outside the school gates. This is a No Parking zone except for our transport vehicles that pick up the students from our support class. Last week we already had the parking officers booking parents. Please note:

- NO DOUBLE PARKING
- NO THREE POINT TURNS OVER DOUBLE LINES
- DO NOT CALL YOUR CHILD TO CROSS THE ROAD ALONE AND COME TO YOUR VEHICLE

If you are late picking up your child, your child will be waiting in the school office. Please talk about this with your child. You must then park your car and come into the office to pick up your child.
